Challenge

Experience activities related to the world of work.

Learning aim:

To experience activities related to the world of work.

Learning outcomes:

- Explore objects, photos and sounds related to the world of work.
- Identify objects related to work and communicate preferences.
- Experience maths activities related to the world of work.

Why is this skill important?

Showing great listening skills is really important as it helps you understand information, ask questions and think carefully about what you've heard.



Differentiation from the initial step 0 to the final step 15.

Success criteria:

Did the learner?

- Explore objects relating to the world of work e.g. work based clothes, familiar items used in a kitchen or office.
- Explore photos relating to the world of work.
- Explore sounds associated with the world of work.
- Explore stacking or piling objects linked to a particular job.
- Track moving items on a computer screen relating to the world of work e.g. police car, postal worker delivering letters.
- Identify work related objects they would like to interact with i.e. through eye pointing or reaching.
- Show a preference for a particular object, activity or colour.
- Experience counting activities linked to the world of work.
